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DWIHN and Chance for Life Bring Game Changing Opportunity to Ex Offenders

'A Leg Up' Program designed for those having served long-term sentences

DETROIT, MI – October 30, 2024 – Returning citizens face tremendous challenges when released from incarceration. They experience varying degrees of difficulty finding jobs and depending on their convictions, the stigma can be overwhelming. The Detroit Wayne Integrated Health Network (DWIHN) and provider, Chance for Life, understands the adversity and are proud to bring an innovative program to the community called, 'A Leg Up'.

"This program is poised to make a significant impact on community reintegration by providing returning citizens with the necessary tools and support to rebuild their lives," said Manny Singla, DWIHN Interim president and CEO.

The program is designed for Wayne County residents, upon release after serving a minimum of 5 years in prison or a combined 10 consecutive years under jurisdiction of state or federal prison with a criminal conviction involving controlled substances. They must be diagnosed with Opioid Use Disorder and any co-occurring substance use disorder (SUD) and mental health condition.

Participants must participate in the following programs and activities with a DWIHN approved provider:

- Mental health therapy with a certified licensed therapist; and a SUD prevention, outpatient, or treatment program
- A mentorship program for a minimum of 120 days or at least 46 hours
- Job-training and coaching
- Family Reintegration program

"This program should significantly reduce the likelihood of recidivism for these individuals," said Thomas Adams, president and CEO of Chance for Life. "We will address critical barriers to care and employment, including transportation and permanent housing, thereby facilitating smoother community reintegration."

The program will provide participants with clothing, transportation, fees for legal documents, security deposits for housing and 60-day temporary housing if needed.

Through programs and services that utilize promising best practices, we promote a community that is supportive and embraces people with mental illness, intellectual and developmental disabilities and substance use disorder.
