All Contracted Providers are required to notify DWIHN of any changes listed below at least 30 calendar days prior to the effective date of change. You can also check the DWIHN website, www.dwihn.org for all policy requirements:

- Provider Name
- · All Changes in Executive management staff
- Office Hours
- Telephone Number
- No longer accepting new people (within 7 days)
- Provider Affiliation Change (i.e. merger)
- Addition or deletion of service(s)
- Addition/change in program location (new or existing)
- Sanctions, suspensions or termination of credential practitioner staff members of your organization
- · Provider Closure (business or locations)
- Required to update Staff Records in MH-WIN when staff changes
- Maintain active and required Insurance minimums while under contract

Partners in Excellence Award



Jaime Junior was just recognized at the CMHAM Fall Conference in Traverse City.

The Partners in Excellence award is designed to recognize those who have, in the process of utilizing community mental health services, enhanced the perception of those services and their recipients within the community.



Living with a disability has never slowed Jaime Junior down.

As a native Detroiter and honor roll student, Jaime knew that if she was going to aspire to a higher calling, she would have to share life's learning experiences with others. After graduating with a business degree from the Detroit College of Business, Jaime actively contributed to the Michigan Developmental Disability Council and the DWIHN Constituents Voice Advisory Board.

As a member of Detroit's Warriors on Wheels organization, Jaime discovered many people living with disabilities who found renewed strength in bonding together to bring positive change. One of the changes she contributed to was greater access to public transportation for those with disabilities.

As a mother of a special need's son, Jaime continuously advocates for those with health challenges. In 2019, she was a spokesperson at the "Walk a Mile in My Shoes" rally in Lansing. Her role as keynote speaker was to continue to bring awareness to the issues facing people with disabilities by educating legislators and putting an end to the stigma related to mental illness, developmental disabilities, substance use and healthcare coverage equality.

Jaime just recently joined the City of Detroit's Office of Disability Affairs, Civil Rights, Inclusion & Opportunity Department as the Community Coordinator. DWIHN partnered with Jaime and her team earlier this year on a Town Hall discussion about Vaccine Hesitancy for people with disabilities as well as on other projects including a television special geared toward people with disabilities, an Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) social media campaign and several other community engagement projects.


Jaime is an excellent teacher and has held several financial literacy and technology trainings for people receiving services through the community mental health system. She continues to look for ways in which she can share her knowledge of the system and encourage her peers to live a life of inclusion and contribution.

BARBERSHOP NALOXONE PRESENTATION (REAL TALK)

DWIHN offers free life-saving Naloxone (Narcan) training to the various Barbershops throughout Wayne County. During the presentation, information is shared with participants such as DWIHN resources and Substance Use Disorder (SUD) literature. Narcan kits containing gloves, CPR mask and 2 Narcan Nasal sprays are distributed to each individual that remained for the entire presentation. When Narcan is administered correctly, it restores breathing that has been dangerously slowed or stopped by an overdose of opioids. Narcan can work from 30-90 minutes, giving emergency responders time to get the person to a hospital.

If you are a person who uses drugs or if you are around people who use drugs, please consider learning how to respond to an opioid overdose and carrying naloxone

Anyone can get naloxone, including family members, friends, and caregivers of at-risk individuals. In short, both individuals taking opioids and anyone who could assist someone experiencing an overdose can get this life-saving antidote

2021 NATIONAL CORE INDICATOR

Each year, the MDHHS participates in the National Core Indicators survey, commonly referred to as "NCI." The survey is administered nationwide and designed to assess the outcome of services provided to people with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (IDD). MDHHS randomly selects the list of respondents to participate. The CRSP, usually the supports coordinator, must complete a pre-survey form for each member who consented to an interview. The survey has two parts: 1) the pre-survey form on the member which the CRSP completes, and 2) an interview with the individual or a family member by the Michigan Developmental Disability Institute, MDHHS' university partner.


In the past, each CRSP has identified a site coordinator to work with DWIHN. That person gets specific instructions on completing the pre-survey form and working with the staff assigned to complete the forms. CRSP must submit completed forms by the due dates given. This work is time-consuming but must get done timely and efficiently. Last year, DWIHN was able to be flexible with deadlines. This year, however, timelines will be strictly enforced.


