Michigan Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths Tool MichiCANS



Mission:

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) provides opportunities, services, and programs that promote a healthy, safe, and stable environment for residents to be self sufficient.



What is the Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths (CANS)?



- The CANS is a multipurpose information integration tool designed to summarize information gathered from multiple sources and assessments.
- This tool is used to support *Family Driven, Youth Guided* care planning and level of care decisions, facilitate quality improvement initiatives, and monitor outcomes of services.
- The CANS is customizable and the version of the tool that Michigan will use is called the MichiCANS.

MichiCANS





Summarizes the Assessment Process

The MichiCANS is intended to be the process by which the assessment information is organized, summarized, used and communicated once it has been collected.

Integrates the Family's Story

The MichiCANS provides a summary of the youth and family's story, and it should be completed as an integration of multiple story tellers.

A Shared Vision for Coordinating Care

The MichiCANS allows for a consensus-based process of determining action levels on items and prioritizing relevant needs and strengths from which a coordinated plan is developed.

Supports Change Management

Mapping the information from the MichiCANS to the plan facilitates outcomes monitoring and management by all members of the team including the youth and family, allowing for plan adjustment, acknowledgement of accomplishments, and celebrating goals that have been met.

Who is the MichiCANS for and is it required to be completed to access services?



- The MichiCANS screener will be the required tool at the point of access for all infants, toddlers, children, youth, and young adults ages birth through 20 (until the day prior to 21). Information gathered from the MichiCANS screener will provide a recommendation related to potential eligibility for services, help guide initial determination of needs and strengths, and provide information for appropriate referrals for behavioral health services.
- At intake, the MichiCANS comprehensive will be used with all infants, toddlers, young children, youth, and young adults ages birth through 20.
 - DECA will also be used with infants, toddlers and young children ages birth to 6 with SED or SED/IDD
- The MichiCANS comprehensive will help to identify areas of need for each child, youth and young adults'
 planning process.
- The MichiCANS will be updated annually and when there is a significant change in life circumstances and/or a behavioral health event.
- The MichiCANS may identify the need for additional assessments.

MichiCANS



- Considerations for infants, toddlers, children, youth and young adults with Serious Emotional Disturbances and Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities.
- Will be used to support the identification of functional limitation for both SED and IDD.
 - 1915i, SEDW, CWP
- Used up to age 21.
- Support cross system understanding for collaboration.
- Elevates strengths and needs for planning.
- May help with early identification of needs for youth and families and supports crisis prevention.

Current Assessment Tools




- Child and Adolescent Functional Assessment Scale (CAFAS).
 - Phase out use of this tool by September 30, 2024.
- Preschool and Early Childhood Functional Assessment Scale (PECFAS).
 - Phase out use of this tool by September 30, 2024.
- Devereux Early Childhood Assessment (DECA).
 - Continue use of this tool up to age 6 with SED and SED/IDD infants, toddlers and young children.

MichiCANS Screener



The MichiCANS Screener will be used at Access Centers as a standard way to guide initial assessment and eligibility determination that guides the level of services children and families will receive, including external behavioral health referrals.

In the future, the MichiCANS Screener will be used by Mobile Intensive Crisis Stabilization Teams to promote access to CMHSP and identify immediate needs.



MichiCANS Status and Impact – Action Levels



Need is dangerous or disabling.

Immediate/intensive action required.

Need interferes with functioning.

Action/intervention required.

Significant history of need, or possible need that is not interfering with functioning.

Watchful waiting, additional assessment.

No evidence of need.

No need for action.

No strength identified.

Considerable effort or building to create and develop strength.

Strength identified.

Requires building in order to be useful for individual or planning.

Useful strength.

Evident and can be accessed by individual; useful for planning.

Well developed centerpiece strength. Easily accessible by individual; essential for planning.

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What is a Decision Support Model?



 A Decision Support Model is a model that runs in the background of your Electronic Health Record and they are used to support clinicians in making decisions related levels of need and services.

• These help to ensure the same models are being used throughout the state and help to support data driven decisions.



MichiCANS Soft Launch



- The soft launch
 - MDHHS pilot with a small group of CMHSP/PIHPs
 - January March 2024
 - CSA pilot with 11 counties in which the MichiCANS Screener will be completed with children entering foster care
 - April June 2024
- Statewide rollout to begin October 1, 2024.

MichiCANS Timeline









January – March 2024

Soft launch sites complete the MichiCANS Screener and Comprehensive for all seeking services birth to 21.

Soft launch sites participate in structured meetings and learning communities provided by Praed Foundation.

Throughout this time, modify processes and procedures related to access and intake, decision support models, and platform based on input.

April – September 2024

Training for those not in soft launch.

Those in soft launch continue with use of tool and learning communities.

Integration of the MichiCANS CC360 version will be fully implemented for CSA and any CMHSP not integrated with PCE.

October 2024

Statewide launch and go-live of MichiCANS for all PIHPs and CMHSPs.

- Certification Training- April through October 2024 and ongoing.
 - TCOM Orientation 3.5 hours.
 - MichiCANS Overview 3.5 hours.
 - Upon completion of certification training, individuals must complete a certification exam and receive a .70 or better to be considered a certified user of the tool.
 - Annual re-certification required.
- Action Planning- 3 hours.
- Supervisor Training- 3 hours.
- Supervisor Community of Practice- 1.5 hours.

MichiCANS Training- Leadership



Agency Leadership

- Leadership Training- 2 hours.
 - Optional for those who wish to have operational knowledge of the tool.
 - Does not result in certification.
